

TIPS FOR ELEVATOR SAFETY

- 5 Do not run through closing doors.
- 4 Hold a parent's hand when entering and exiting the elevator.
- 3 Watch your step.
- 2 Do not use your hand to stop the elevator door (use the button).
- 1 Do not attempt to pry elevator doors open.

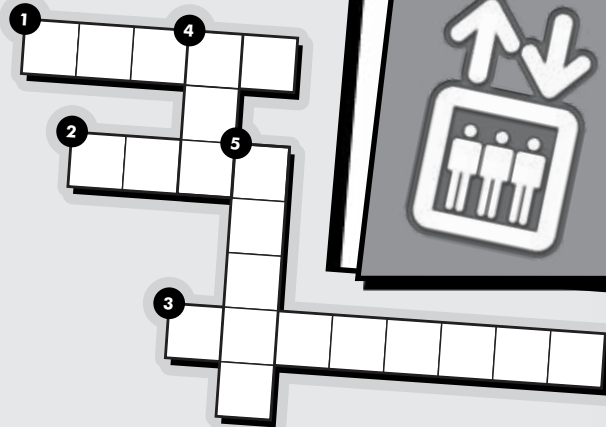
